

OHMVR Commission 2026 Goals

Annual goals for the Commission to be reviewed and approved annually.

Discussion

1. Annually review and revise the OHMVR Commission Goals and Ad Hoc Committees, Charters, and their active or paused status.
2. Each Commissioner will strive to attend a minimum of 3 out of 4 Commission meetings and tours annually.
3. Actively engage stakeholders, community leaders, non-profit partners, safety partners, and grantees as opportunities arise through Commission meetings, agenda topics, ad hoc committees, the OHMVR Access Project, tours, and other means to ensure the Commission is serving the broader OHV community.
4. Support the OHMVR Division efforts to modernize the Grants Program while exploring opportunities to optimize revenue across the SVRAs.
5. Support efforts to advance long-term sustainability for the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund (OHVTF) by supporting the maximization of revenue opportunities of the OHVTF.

OHMVR Commission 2026 Ad Hoc Committees

Proposed Ad Hoc Committees:

1. OHMVR Program Economic Benefits – Work with the OHMVR Division staff and consultants to develop a strategy to inform the broader public about the economic benefits of OHV use in CA.

2. OHMVR Public Access Project – Support project staff in identifying and acquiring additional lands to expand OHV recreational use, as well as [potential acquisition partners].

4. Volunteer and Community Activities – Work with OHMVR and SVRA leaders, NGO, OHV, community and other partners to participate in hands-on activities at SVRAs, such as clean-ups and community events. This could also include spearheading Commissioner attendance at seasonal OHV events such as King of the Hammers, Tierra del Sol, etc.

5. Annual Safety Summit – Collaborate with the Safety Leadership team on the agenda topics and featured speakers for the annual Safety Summit, support and promote attendance by Commissioners to the regional Safety Weeks and promote general safety practices and training.

6. ODSVRA Dialogue – Meet three times/year with Oceano Dunes District Superintendent and members of the OHV community to discuss operations, maintenance, special projects, and any other topical issues.

7. OSV, PCT and E-Bike Issues – Meet with OHMVR leaders, USFS and PCTA representatives to discuss OHV and OSV trail interactions and conflicts, solutions and needs.

8. 2028 Triannual Report – The commission's liaison with the division staff to create the 2028 OHMVR Commission Program report. The report will cover 2025, 2026 and 2027 per the PRC § 5090.24 (h). It is due January 1, 2028. The ad hoc committee will give the commission updates on the progress of the report and assist with content suggestions.
