 area.
- Being a camper and hiker in the Cuyamaca State Park since the early 60's I have seen very little
 change in the conditions of the trails and terrain flora + fauna other than the fires over the last
 10 years. When you take so much land and designate it as "Historic" and a "Cultural Preserve"
 that is the first step to closing down the existing trails through that land.
- My suggestion would be to leave well enough along. After the number of years of using Cuyamaca State park my entire family has learned the importance of taking care of the land around you and it will always be there for generations to come.

<u>#3</u>

- Resource, Alt B Expanded W of GV falls/Horse Camp, Use closer existing horse camp sites for generator equipped rigs and make the new ones increasingly more primitive.
- Rebuild Hual-Cu-Cuish into retreat with cabins, with day-use parking for equestrians.
- Paso fire station at administrative/interpretive center
- South to North trail connection with suitable side routes for equestrians on dangerous sections (Mountain bike danger)
- River crossings should offer mountain bike only bridges as well as hiker/equestrian crossings
- Specials events for equestrians as well as mountain bike fund raisers.
