NOTICE OF CLASS SETTLEMENT

If you are a person with a mobility, vision, and/or hearing disability who has visited or attempted to visit California State Park facilities:

A class action settlement agreement ("Consent Decree") that may affect your rights is under consideration. The Consent Decree will require system-wide access improvements in California State Park facilities for visitors with disabilities over an eleven-year settlement period. If approved by the court, this settlement will bar future injunctive relief claims against the State of California and its Department of Parks and Recreation concerning physical access to California State Parks prior to and during the settlement period.
