Standish-Hickey State Recreation Area Final Report July - October 2018

OPERATOR: Mendocino Area Parks Association (MAPA) and Team Standish

BACKGROUND

State Parks closed Standish-Hickey SRA in February 2012. MAPA and Team Standish reopened the park on July 6, 2012 under the provisions of AB42. Over the six years since then, we operated the park applying sound business practices. With the judicious use of a combination of grants, earned revenue and AB1478 Matching Funds we have completed a number of the deferred maintenance projects required by our Operating Agreement and in general have upgraded the facilities in the Standish-Hickey. These efforts have been reflected in the increase of both park attendance and revenue each year, as noted in the chart below.

As the MAPA's Operating Agreement expired on October 31, 2018 this will be our final Report.

PARK MANAGEMENT

MAPA's Mission Statement is: "To Inspire and Ensure the Stewardship of the State Parks of Mendocino County"

Our tagline is: "Appreciation through Education promotes Preservation".

These serve as the foundation of our philosophy of how MAPA and Team Standish managed Standish-Hickey State Recreation Area.

In addition to the Operating Staff, below, overall management was exercised by the MAPA Board of Directors through a four member Standish-Hickey Management Committee. The team was comprised of the MAPA Executive Director and three board members, one of whom, Jeff Hedin represented Team Standish.

It was the function of the Management Committee to oversee the general operation of the park, maintain compliance with the Operating Agreement, provide general administrative support and operating policies and, in general, serve as an interface to DPR staff. To accomplish this, members of the Management Team and Operating Staff had regular meetings with CA State Parks Sector and District staff. In addition, Operating Staff had regular contact with their DPR counterparts on an ongoing basis as did Management Team members at a higher level.

STANDISH-HICKEY OPERATING STAFF

During the camping Peak Season, Standish-Hickey employed 11 part-time staff as follows:

- Park Manager
- Assistant Park Manager/Maintenance Chief
- Visitor Service Manager
- Three Visitor Service assistants
- Maintenance Lead
- Three maintenance workers
- In addition we had two camp hosts who were required to put in 25 hours per week of volunteer time consistent with CA State Parks policy.

All employees were paid in excess of the minimum wage, commensurate with their level of responsibility and were generally scheduled to work less than 32 hours/week. During "surge" periods, i.e., a holiday weekend or a special event, certain employees worked up to 40 hours/week. Employment is seasonal, dropping to minimum staffing in the off season.

Prior to employment all employees had to pass a background check including LiveScan by a law enforcement agency.

* NOTE: MAPA was reimbursed for the Executive Director and Office Staff payroll based on the percentage of time spent working on Standish-Hickey affairs.

CAMPING SEASONS

The Park's Peak Season is from May 15 - Sept 15 with the rest of the year being off-season. During the off season only the Rock Creek campground (35 campsites) remains open year round. We opened the Hickey campground (63 campsites) on May 1 - October 31 and the Redwood Campground (63 campsites) from July 1 - September 15. The Redwood campground opening date was heavily dependent on our ability to put a seasonal Bailey bridge across the South Fork of the Eel River, a Federal Wild and Scenic River. The start date of bridge installation is dictated by the presence of salmonids in the river and governed by both state and federal regulations.

JULY- OCTOBER 2018-IN-REVIEW

Having made the decision to return Standish-Hickey SRA to CA State Parks at the conclusion of our Operating Agreement on October 31, 2018, our main focus was providing a quality, enjoyable outdoor experience for more than 13,500 campers and visitors. Attendance was down slightly during the summer camping season due to the Ranch, River, Carr and Camp wildfires in

the central valley that reduced road access to the coast from inland communities for extended periods of time.

During our six years of operating Standish-Hickey we were fortunate to have had very few serious incidents involving campers. However, on July 4th weekend this year an aging tanoak tree in the Hickey loop fell across two campsites demolishing three vehicles. Fortunately, there were no injuries. The fallen tree had not been identified as a hazard during a hazardous tree survey by CA State Parks in Spring 2018 that resulted in the removal of 56 hazardous trees. As the result of an insurance investigation, MAPA was relieved of liability for this occurrence.

INTERPRETER AND INTERN PROGRAMS. In 2018 we decided to suspend the interpreter and intern positions due to ongoing theft and vandalism from squatters on private property adjacent to our staff cabins. The viability of these positions was dependent on our ability to provide housing.

ONGOING OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

Although MAPA will no longer be operating Standish-Hickey, we suggest these opportunities to State Parks as staffing, funding and volunteers are available.

- Extend trails in Redwood Campground, create a new Lookout Trail destination. A dreamed of project would be to coordinate with the Redwood Forest Foundation to build a trail through their Usal Redwood Forest property from Standish to Usal Beach Campground.
- Finish self-guided Taber Trail brochure and install numbered interpretation posts.
- Install/repair bollards to eliminate degradation of some campsites.
- Make Hickey campground "family designated" and ban alcohol from those sites.
- Promote more community-based events and volunteerism for park.
- Partner with Interpretive Associations, schools and youth-sponsoring organizations to make Standish-Hickey a destination for nature education field trips.
- One of our biggest issues was security. CA State Parks was unable to provide ranger staff due to chronic understaffing so any response severely strained their already limited resources. This issue affected both park visitors and staff. As noted above, it was necessary to suspend our interpreter and intern programs due to security reasons. When adequate security can be guaranteed we highly recommend that both the interpreter and intern programs be reestablished.
- Another continuing challenge has been recruiting Camp Hosts, one for each campground loop, to help with late night noise issues and other Camp Host duties. to achieve this, it will be necessary to upgrade the camp host sites with full hook-ups.
- Currently the sole source of water for the park is from a well in the bed of the Eel River. As such, it is difficult or impossible to repair or service during periods of high water. Another well, as an alternate source of water, needs to be developed.

DEFERRED MAINTENANCE

With only a few projects within our span of control remaining on our Deferred Maintenance list, little work was done on those projects during the final four months of operation.

PARK OPERATION WRAPUP ACTIVITIES

During August through October, meetings were held with North Coast Redwoods District staff to finalize park operations and determine disposition of equipment and remaining funds. It was decided that all rolling equipment, truck, ATVs, golf carts and trailer, would be transferred to the Humboldt Redwoods Interpretive Association (HRIA) stipulating continued use in Standish-Hickey SRA. Remaining tools and maintenance equipment would be donated to CA State Parks. Unused grant funds would be returned or donated as per the wishes of the original grantees and any remaining funds in MAPA's Standish-Hickey accounts would be donated to the North Coast Redwoods District for continued operation of Standish-Hickey SRA as stipulated in our Operating Agreement.

FINANCIALS

A financial statement is attached to this report. Although our Standish-Hickey Operating Agreement expired on October 31, 2018, the financials cover the period July 1 – December 30, 2018 in order to capture remaining financial activity except those associated with outstanding insurance and Workers Comp audits. When those audits are complete, in the spring of 2019, remaining funds will be donated to CA State Parks to assist in Standish-Hickey SRA operations.

SUMMARY

It has been a privilege operating Standish-Hickey SRA for the past six years and four months. We were challenged in reopening a facility that had been closed for five months and proud that our period of stewardship has been one of continued improvement of park facilities and amenities. Our sustained growth is reflected in the steadily increasing number of campers, visitors and revenue. We continually applied "lessons learned" during our first five years of operation, successfully leveraged our nonprofit contacts to bring additional financial resources to improve park operations and provided a positive visitor experience. None of this would have been possible without the fantastic support of the Leggett community, the marvelous cooperation from the DPR Eel River Sector staff, the North Coast Redwoods District, the DPR Sacramento offices, and of course, our own very dedicated Operations staff and Team Standish.

This past six plus years have truly been a team effort with a lot of disparate players coming together to contribute to our success. It is with a certain amount of sadness - and yet a tremendous feeling of satisfaction at what we have accomplished over the past more than six years - that we return Standish-Hickey SRA to CA State Parks. It is our hope that MAPA has successfully demonstrated to CA State Parks the benefits that can be leveraged and realized by partnerships with nonprofit organizations to serve the citizens of California in the years ahead.
