Minimum Eligibility Requirements:

1. Grant applicant must own/manage any aspect of the water in a reservoir;
2. The reservoir must be open to the public for recreation; and

3. Grant applicant must demonstrate that the reservoir is uninfested with dreissenid mussels.

Reservoirs that are currently covered by a two-year 2024 QZ Grant, will not be considered for funding in this 2025 cycle.

To demonstrate that the reservoir is uninfested, applicants must provide mussel monitoring data collected since March 2024. Monitoring data can be from surface surveys, artificial substrates, and plankton tows.
