

Fishing Regulations

Silverwood Lake State Recreation Area

Anglers 16 years and older must have a valid California State fishing license in their possession.

Live threadfin shad may be taken by hand or with a handheld dip net to be used as bait at Silverwood only. No live fish may be brought to Silverwood for use as bait. No trout may be possessed in a live condition on any boat.

Legally acquired and possessed invertebrates, mollusks, crustaceans, amphibians (except salamanders), fish eggs and treated processed foods may be used as bait. Dead ocean fish may be used as bait.


All fish may be taken only by angling with one closely attended rod and line, or one hand line with not more than three hooks nor more than three artificial lures (each lure may have three hooks attached). Anglers in possession of a valid second rod stamp may use up to two rods at Silverwood Lake.

Fishing is permitted in most areas of the lake, however, fishing at the inlet, spillway and outlet areas is a violation of PC 555 and violators will be cited. Restricted areas are clearly marked with signs and buoy lines. Tying boats to buoy lines is also prohibited.
